

COVID-19 Guidelines for the 2020 WCFS Family Leadership Conference

Our desire is for conference attendees to be healthy and as undistracted as possible. We understand that our families are coming from locations that are in different stages of managing COVID-19. Individual families also have different understandings and concerns about the potential impact of the virus and may have unique circumstances that put them more or less at risk than those around them.

The WCFS Family Leadership Conference is a closed, private, church sponsored event that is not open to the general public. While such church activities are exempt* from the State of Pennsylvania COVID orders, we ask that all attendees **take responsibility** for the safety and well-being of each member of their family and use common sense protocols in their interactions during conference. We also ask that attendees be alert and **show respect** to the comfort zones and concerns of each other during camp.

Consider wearing a face covering of some type when moving through places where social distancing is not possible, such as entering and leaving the conference hall, unless there is a personal safety or health concern. Our group is expected to be small enough so that indoor arrangements will provide adequate spacing.

Our host, Roxbury Holiness Camp, is a religious organization not open to the general public, and as such, is exempt from Pennsylvania COVID orders for the general public. However, they are reminding all groups of the generally established COVID-19 protocols:

Wash hands regularly; Stay home if you are feeling ill; Cover your cough with your elbow; Try to stay 6 feet away from people; Do not shake hands or hug – use an elbow bump or some other type of greeting that does not require touch; Try to avoid touching your face, and be attentive to high risk health conditions that make you susceptible to contracting the disease.

***NOTE:** While travelling and stopping for gas or shopping, please note the following PA guidance:

Unless there is a personal safety or health concern, the State of Pennsylvania is requiring face coverings to be worn if “outdoors and unable to consistently maintain a distance of six feet from individuals who are not members of their household; in any indoor location where members of the public are generally permitted.”
